



Waterfront Bridges Replacement Project

Public Meeting

The City of Astoria will host an **Open House from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Tuesday, March 29, 2016 at City Hall** (1095 Duane Street, Astoria) to share the initial bridge designs and proposed construction approach for the Waterfront Bridges Replacement Project. The design team will be seeking community feedback on:

- hand railing design options and
- pedestrian detours to access waterfront businesses and the Riverwalk during construction.

The Project will replace the waterfront bridges that connect 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, and 11th Streets to the Columbia River waterfront. The existing bridges were built in 1895 with timber foundations. Although repairs have kept these old structures in service for more than a century, many trucks and emergency service vehicles cannot use them due to weight restrictions.

To provide full pedestrian and vehicle access to the businesses and attractions along this portion of the waterfront, the City will replace the old structures with new concrete bridges that have steel supports. Designs for the replacement bridges are expected to be complete by spring 2017. Construction is anticipated to begin in fall 2017 and conclude in late spring 2019.
